SCHOOL NURSE MESSAGE

Vision screening will be completed for all kindergarten, second and fourth grade students on Monday, October 21, with assistance from the Manitowoc Lions Club. Students should wear their glasses for the screening. If your child does not pass the screening, you will receive a letter with further recommendations. If you do not receive a letter, your child has passed the screening.

Per the State of Wisconsin Immunization Law, all students must be up-to-date on their required school immunizations by the 30th day of school (October 15). If your child is not up-to-date, you have already received a phone call and a letter from the school office. Please take care of these immunizations as soon as possible, or contact the school office to discuss signing a waiver.

FRANKLIN FREE BOOK STORE

Students can take books, keep them or, after they are done reading them, they return the books to the same book rack. Students can even donate books of their own for other students to enjoy reading them.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION NEWS

Our school recognizes that riding scooters, bikes and in-line skates are an important part of growing up (great lifetime activity). These activities help enhance balance, coordination, motor skills and provide a great cardiovascular workout. We also know each year, many children are injured or killed while riding bicycles, scooters and in-line skates. We have decided to do something about that.



All students in third, fourth and fifth grades will learn basic in-line skating safety skills. Your child's class will soon begin a unique unit to teach them to be better, safer riders. Your child will learn basic in-line skate safety skills through classroom discussion and practice riding sessions held in the gym. Basic skills such as stopping and turning will be practiced.

Because head injuries are the most serious kind of bicycle/scooter/skate injury and the easiest to prevent, each child will be required to wear an approved bicycle/skate helmet and wrist guards whenever riding during the program. Knee and elbow pads will also be available to those students who would like to use them. Students are encouraged to bring their own helmets, pads and clean indoor skates for these lessons. Helmets/pads/skates will be available for those who do not have any.

In order for your child to participate in this activity, Miss Ganser must have a signed permission slip on file. Permission slips must be returned by October 28. Make sure you check out the Franklin Physical Education Facebook page for pictures of this activity!


