COLD WEATHER IS COMING!

Quality time spent up front building listening skills, as well as cognitive and behavioral skills, paves the way for classrooms filled with shared ideas, encouraging words of support, students that work really well together, and strong teacher relationships. By continuing with skill lessons taught on Mondays, and Class Council gatherings on Fridays, the students can continue to learn and practice real life-long skills all school year. The GAT curriculum is designed to teach children to think critically, solve problems thoughtfully, and work with teammates cooperatively and effectively. NURSING NEWS

PINKEYE - Does your child have pinkeye? Unsure if he/she can return to school? In MOST cases, children can attend school with pinkeye whether or not treatment has been initiated. The one exception is if he/she cannot stop touching or rubbing the eyes. Good handwashing is the best method of prevention!

HEAD LICE - Head lice is typically seen more often in the winter months because kids are spending more time indoors, sharing hats/scarves and having sleepovers. Head lice is spread by direct head-to-head contact. We recommend parents check their child's scalp regularly and especially if increased scratching is noted.

STUDENT COUNCIL

Our Student Council membership is now 40 students, and they are all very excited to work on the various projects various projects we are planning for the school and local communities!

This year, Student Council is going to be responsible for raising and taking down the American flag in front of the school.
