#### YOUTH ART MONTH



### Vote on Tuesday, April 1 or Earlier by Absentee Ballot

On April 1, 2025, MPSD will ask voters for permission to borrow \$25 million to perform critical maintenance, safety, security and building infrastructure work across our schools.

If approved, the borrowing costs will be offset by operational budget savings, resulting in no increase to taxpayers for the facilities work. This will be achieved through primarily staffing changes that Interim Supt. Lee Thennes is presenting to the Board of Education on March 11.

#### Remember to vote!

You can vote in person at the City Clerk's Office or at your Town Hall. A photo ID is required to vote by absentee ballot (via mail or in person) and at polling places on election day, Tuesday, April 1. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

You also can vote absentee in-person from March 18 to March 28 at the City Clerk's office, 900 Quay St., Manitowoc, WI 54220. Absentee voting hours for the City of Manitowoc will be:

March 18-20: 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. March 21: 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. March 24-27: 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. March 28: 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The students have been working very hard and are excited to perform for you! We look forward to seeing everyone at this concert.



March is an exciting month at Franklin as the third quarter draws to an end on March 28<sup>th</sup>. Your children are working hard each day using the Success for All program. The program was developed with the goal of using the best science available to ensure that students have excellent instruction and other essential supports so that they will learn the critical skills of reading.

Soon I will begin assessing reading fluency of our Wings students ensuring the children are reading at an appropriate rate (typically grades 2-5). They are also taking weekly tests focused on vocabulary and story comprehension. For our Roots students (typically first grade), I will be assessing their sight word level, oral reading accuracy, comprehension and fluency. Our KinderCorner students are working hard developing letter names and sound knowledge, as well as the ability to print their letters accurately. They are also studying concepts of print and learning to sound out words and full sentences.

Oral language development is another important skill that all children work on as they grow their capacity to speak in complete sentences and communicate well with others. How can you help us on our journey? Please have your child read for 20 minutes each weeknight and sign their Read and Respond homework sheet. In early April, we'll share updates with you regarding your child's progress.

# Too Sick For School?

The below guidelnes can help parents determine when a child should remain home from school due to illness:

Fever 100.4 degrees or higher- may return to school once fever free for 24 hours without the use of medications.

Vomiting and/or Diarrhea (3 or more unexplained liquid stools in 24 hour period)— may return to school 24 hours after last episode.

Pinkeye- may attend school unless the child is not able to stop touching their eye(s). Treatment not required to return to school.

Rash- may attend school as long as no fever present. Some rashes (impetigo, scabies, ringworm) require treatment before returning to school.

Note: this list is not all-inclusive but instead the most common illnesses seen in the school setting.
